SHANA is one of few schools of India whose curriculum is based on Learning & Life Skills. Learning and Life Skills are compilation of different tools, methods, techniques, processes which help students to enhance their rate of learning. These tools are scientifically tested to enhance thinking skills, creativity, concentration, reasoning, analytical skills, memory skills, study skills, note taking and confidence level of the children.

Important Components of our curriculum.

Linguistic Capacity Enhancement–Our curriculum delves deeper into the need of communication skills and provides adequate opportunity so that they are good listeners, sound speakers, veracious readers and prolific writers.

Vedic Mathematics- Apart from regular mathematics, they are also trained in Vedic mathematics from class III onwards which help them achieve confidence in life. 90% of our students from classes III to X know table up to 100 and around 50% of them know tables up to 1000. 



19 August 2024 – Raksha Bandhan (Monday)

Literally meaning "safety" and "bond", Raksha Bandhan celebrates the unique bond between a brother and his sister. The festival is observed on the full-moon day or Purnima in the Hindu calendar month of Shravan. This year it falls on August 19.

The story of Raksha Bandhan is related to the Hindu epic Mahabharata. In Mahabharata, Lord Krishna once cut his finger which then started bleeding. Seeing this Draupadi then tore a piece of cloth from her saree and tied it on his finger to stop the bleeding. The piece of cloth then became a sacred thread. Considering the cloth that she tied a sacred thread, Krishna promised her that he will protect her from all evils throughout his life. When the Kauravas tried to disrobe Draupadi — after pulling her by her hair, dragging her to the court, and manhandling her — Krishna salvages her dignity by providing immeasurable reams of cloth to keep her covered.

The act of Draupadi tying a piece of cloth on Krishna's wounded finger is synonymous with Raksha Bandhan — a girl tying Rakhi on her brother's wrist and he, in turn, promising to protect her just as Krishna protected Draupadi.

- 3. In the epic Mahabharata, the five Pandava brothers had been tricked into losing a bet in gambling after which the Kauravas banished them for 12 years. As per the epic, Diwali is the day on which the Pandavas return to Hastinapur on the night of Kartik Amavasya.
- 4. In Sikhism, Diwali is related to the event of Guru Hargobind's release by Mughal emperor Jehangir.
- 5. In Jainism, the festival of Diwali is celebrated to observe the anniversary of Mahavira's soul finally attaining Nirvana.
- 6. In some states in western India, such as Gujarat, the festival of Diwali signifies the start of a new year.
- 7. Eastern India, especially West Bengal, celebrates Diwali as Kali Puja, in honour of Goddess Kali, who is known to have gone on a destructive rampage to cleanse the earth of all demons.
